



New Harmony, Indiana is a special place and our CIR New Harmony "Kunstfest" Weekend is a very special event, and we only do it about every five years.

CIR's New Harmony "Kunstfest" Weekend Auto Tour will be brought back this year on September 20 – 21, 2025 after a four-year hiatus. Kunstfest is New Harmony's annual German arts, crafts, food and music festival and their largest and most popular festival of the year. "Kunst" means art in German.

New Harmony is an Indiana State Museum Historic Site and supported by the Lilly Foundation, Ball Foundation, Baffler Trust and the University of Southern Indiana. New Harmony was the location in 1814 where Harmonists from Harmony, Pennsylvania tried to establish a Utopian Society. They created many permanent structures that have all been restored and preserved. The entire town is kind of a dichotomy. If you have never been here before, we strongly recommend you take the Guided Group Historical Tour at 1 PM to fully understand New Harmony and all it represent

By that time we needed sleep, so back to the Hilton. On Sunday, after a much easier drive to the track and more fine dining, we got to watch Porches #7 and #6 come in first and third. They had been racing so hard against each other that it seemed like they might eliminate each other. Fortunately, #60, an Acura, passed #6 and separated them. There was celebrating in the Racehaus with a Porsche win!

We returned to the hotel a little tired, but we took a walk along Daytona Beach, where the water was quite chilly. Mostly retracing our route, we drove back home on Monday and Tuesday, arriving in time to get our two happy dogs from the kennel.

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Weet Your President Wike Kelley

urrent Central Indiana Region (CIR) president, Mike Kelley, has a vision for the club. The CIR is an anomaly in the car club world. We are growing! Other clubs, not just car clubs, but special interest groups in general are down in membership. Under Kelley's leadership, the CIR is really moving in a positive direction.

But where did this all start? "My enthusiasm with Porsche started in high school, but my first Porsche was a new, off the lot, 944 S2. And that was several years after high school," said Kelley.

Mike was working for Alcoa Aluminum in Evansville, and kept spotting a brand new 1989 944 S2 on the lot of the D-Patrick Porsche dealership. "The car was new and just seemed to be sitting there. I finally stopped in and made an offer on it that was in 1990. That's how this passion for Porsche all started." The Purdue grad had the car for three years as a daily driver, but with two kids, Jenney and Andy, the 944 was not the family car he needed at the time. However, the Porsche bug had bitten like a virus without a vaccine.

Fast forward to 1997, back in Indy, Mike now working at General Motors in advanced vehicles met Tasha, a fellow Purdue Engineering grad. The couple were soon married. Mike, now Porsche-less, served on the board of Artomobilia in Carmel for a couple of years and was a judge at the CIR's Cruz Zionsville for a few years.

Just as COVID hit in 2019 the couple had moved to Springfield, MO, where Mike took a job as president of the electrical division of Springfield ReManufacturing Corporation. Mike and Tasha decided it was time for the second Kelley Family Porsche.

They found a 2014 Cayman at Porsche Springfield calling to them. "That was with the Ozark Region. I had a joint membership with CIR and Ozark. With the Cayman we did autocross and some HPDEs. Ozark was small but a fun active group. They asked me about being president even. I said I would think about it."

"Then, I got a call from the local Porsche dealer, they offered me a build allocation spot for a 911, so we took delivery of a 992, 911S in October of 2022 in Atlanta at the Porsche Experience Center!"

Early in 2022 the family moved back to Indy, now with a couple more kids, a son Matt, now an engineer at Boeing and daughter, Katie, in high school. Tasha, both an engineer and an attorney, joined Rolls-Royce in the Federal Regulatory Department and Mike as director of transmission remanufacturing at Allison Transmissions. Mike got involved with the CIR management team and took the president seat in 2024.

Kelley brings some goals to the region, to improve both board and member communication and participation in CIR activities. "We are bringing the CIR into the 21st Century. We recently added Microsoft Teams as the main communication and archiving tool for the board. We will now have all the club documents one safe location. Better continuity. We already have totally revamped our accounting practices and are actively recruiting members to move into club management. Financially we are in great shape, now functioning as we should."

Under Mike's leadership, just take a look at the CIR calendar, more and more events are being added. All great things for our Central Indiana Region!







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FOCUS ON B.J. Nichols

ho would ever think Indianapolis is the home of one of the twenty top jewelers in America? Reis-Nichols Jewelers with shops in Indianapolis and Greenwood, is just that. So, what does this have to do with the Central Indiana Region of the Porsche Club, you may ask? Well, William P. (B.J.) Nichols, Jr., president

and owner of Reis-Nichols Jewelers, loves very fine jewelry, great time pieces, and Porsche cars with a passion. In his words, "Europeans, especially the Germans, understand making the best and making it special, be it watches like Rolex or automobiles like Porsche."

I did some track days at Putnam. I got hooked, but I was getting swamped by much faster 911s, and my wife, Lori, who was watching, said 'You need to get a Porsche!' I said that was great idea! Turned out Tom Wood happened to have an allocation open for a 911GT3, so I ordered one, without ever having even driven any Porsche."

That was October of 2014, and in March 2015 B.J. took delivery of his first Porsche. Yes a GT3. At that point he also joined the PCA, The Club at Putnam Park, and hired CIR member and professional racer, Dan Clarke as his private driving coach. All that certainly qualifies him as a true hardcore car guy. "After doing HPDE's at several tracks, I was running a lot. Dan (Clarke) said I was beating up the GT3 badly and needed a proper race car. I am sort of competitive." That led to B.J. going PCA-Club racing with a Cayman GT4 from 2016 to 2023.

With racing now becoming a part of his life B.J. founded Reis-Nichols Racing. The team took on the challenge of the IMSA Porsche Carrera Cup Pro Series in 911GT3 Cup cars with Dan Clarke driving for the Reis-Nichols Racing team. The team in 2023 took a second at Indy, and third at three other Carrera Cup events. This was followed by a third at Indy in the 2024 running.

For 2025, B.J. and Reis-Nichols Racing is now partnering in CSM Racing. "I had fun driving and still do, but at my age it is time to give back and help others. I want to have influence and some impact in the racing

sport."

B.J. purchased Reis-Nichols Jewelers in 1986 while still a student at the Indiana University Kelley School of Business, (Class of '87) with the dream of making it the most amazing, cool, jewelry store in the Midwest. In 1957, William Sr., B.J.'s dad, started the business with B.J. buying the family-owned business from dad when William retired. A trademark of the stores is a layout allowing customers to watch jewelers and watchmakers at work behind glass walls. It is kind of an insider's look at the art and craftsmanship being done right before their eyes.

While diamonds and fine jewelry are main thrust of the business, watches comprise a large part of the Reis-Nichols trade. They are a major Rolex Jeweler and the largest TAG Heuer dealer in the country. By the way, TAG Heuer in now the official timekeeper of F1, Indy 500 and NTT IndyCar series.

Lori and B.J. have two children and live in Zionsville. The CIR is an amazing organization. Yes, it is the people not just the cars!

acing is an integral part of the Central Indiana
Region's spirit and nature. No matter what our
friends in North Carolina say, we are the World's Center
of Motorsports. A new and fast-growing part of that is a
long-time CIR-PCA member, Stephen Simpson. Along with
co-owner Matthias Czabok, they formed CSM Racing,
based in Brownsburg, Indiana.

If Stephen's name sounds familiar, it is because Simpson has a win in LMPC class at the 2016 Daytona 24 Hour race, along with over 70 wins in both open wheel and sportscar classes from around the world. That includes a year in the Indy Pro Series, now known as Indy NXT, and seven years with JDC-Miller in several international classes.

The native of Cape Town, South Africa, won the local Formula Ford championship at age 16, moved to England at 17, and sign a professional race deal with the Benetton Junior Team at 18.

Right after his Daytona 24 win, yes, he got a Rolex Daytona time piece, and he needed the band sized. So, he stopped into Ries-Nichols Jewelers, one of the world's largest Rolex dealers. "The woman at the counter said, our owner B.J. is into car racing, and she called him out," said Stephen, "That was just at the time B.J. was doing DEs. That led to a lasting friendship. B.J. is now a partner with us (In CSM Racing). He helped source the cars and definitely helps me

on the business side of things. B.J.'s title is senior advisor, but he is a mentor to us also."

"I always loved Porsche, so we made the decision to run both the IMSA Michelin Pilot Challenge and VP Sports Car Challenge. We run Cayman GT4RS Clubsport cars in both series. Rules are almost the same and Porsche Motorsports has been a great partner with us. We have four guys in Pilot series, Gordon Scully, Morgan Burkhard, Robert Megennis and Nikita Lastochkin with Jackson Lee (Son of Fox TV's IndyCar pit reporter, Kevin Lee.) driving in the VP Racing series. All five are young Americans with some very impressive credentials."

Co-owner, Matthias Czabok brings a background with over thirty years of experience within the motorsport industry as team owner, driver, and manager with IMSA, WEC, IndyCar and CART teams concentrating more on the sponsor/business side. Simpson runs the day-to-day operation. The team currently has a small race shop in Brownsburg, with three GT4RS Clubsport cars. While the cars look almost exactly like a Cayman GT4 production car and do have some production components, they are true and proper hand-built race cars. Porsche will not say exactly how many were or are being built, but they are available if you have the funds

Porsche Motorsport does provide strong support to the teams including on-site services at all the events.

Stephen pointed out, "One of the great things about all this is that parts and support from Porsche Motorsports in Atlanta is great and even some of the parts we get through Tom Wood's parts department. The dash, steering parts, even the A/C is right out of the production cars."

CSM Racing was formed in May of 2023, but the young team has big ambitions. First in sports cars with near-term plans to move into a bigger facility to support more cars in more classes moving up the IMSA ladder. First in the IMSA endurance racing and then perhaps into American open wheel racing. That could include Formula Regional Americas, the FIA series in North America, F-2000 Pro, and someday Indy NXT. As Simpson put it, "We plan to be around in twenty years and much bigger than we are now. We want to be the next Ganassi Racing!"



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Book Review

hil Hill A Driving Life is a book that sparks memories for my generation, lots of memories indeed. First, it is an in depth look at one of the world's greatest drivers, Phil Hill, (1927-2008) the first and only American-born F1 champion. (Mario Andretti was not born in the USA.) It is not a biography of Hill's life, but a compendium of his thoughts on driving, on competitors, on tracks and the story of cars and driving them.

Second, it is the memory of one of the world greatest automobile photographers, John Lamm (1944-2020) He was known as the man that defined Road & Track (R&T) magazine. R&T was started 1947 and is still published today. It was the bible of all things automotive in the second half of the last century. Lamm's 37-year stint with R&T as a writer and photographer set the standard for automobile feature reporting and photography for all time. He was a storyteller with both a typewriter and camera.

Phil Hill A Driving Life is a collection of feature articles from R&T, all authored by Hill as he tested vehicles from a 1886 Benz three-wheeled horseless carriage replica, to Dale


Earnhart's 2000 NASCAR Monte Carlo, the 'Black #3'. All article are printed just as they were in the magazine over the years. Lamm and Hill often worked together and most of the photos in *Phil Hill A Driving Life* are Lamm's. Each chapter having a heading, an observation, from Lamm about the circumstances leading up to that chapter.

Phil Hill, a University of California grad, was a thoughtful, gentle man, known for his unmatched precision at the wheel. He won his F1 championship driving for Enzo Ferrari in 1961 and was a legend at LeMans with three overall wins, all in Ferraris. A superlative writer, he often wrote in the first person. Reading his work is like sitting with a friend near a fireplace with a glass of 15-year-old bourbon, just chatting together.

Seeing John Lamm's photography illustrating Hill's words, brings that conversation alive with a vibrance few artists have mastered. He understood drivers, cars, racing, and communicating.

A signature feature was the Road & Track road and tack tests of every conceivable form of transportation. In reality *Phil Hill A Driving Life* and Road & Track offer a lesson in history.

CAR WASHES: SIMPLE, RIGHT?

ashing the car seems so simple. Wash the car with soap and water, dry it off and voila! Clean. Unfortunately, it is not that simple. The truth is there are many variables which could actually hinder your vehicles appearance from the simple wash process. There are four common wash practices. Tunnel, touchless, rinseless and of course, hand wash. I wanted to break down some of the pros and cons of these wash methods to educate and promote safe washing!

Tunnel Washes

A tunnel wash is typically a place where cars move along a conveyor belt through a series of rotating brushes. These services are fast, efficient, and cheap. If convenience is your main concern, there is no better bang for the buck. These services often come with a towel dry at the end and can even offer interior services

as well. Unfortunately, the brushes are created as a "one- size-fits-all-car-shapes" solution, which can be very harmful to your vehicle. I have heard of emblems, wipers, and even body components being ripped off in the tunnel. Plus, the dirt and debris from the cars ahead is drug across your paint as the brushes are not cleaned between cars. The abrasiveness of these systems will quickly add swirl marks, haze, and potentially deep scratching to the surface of your vehicle. It will not take

long before vehicle appearance is negatively impacted, which hurts your resale value. These systems will also impact paint protection film and ceramic coatings and will violate warranties with your local detailer.

Touchless Washes

Touchless car washes avoid direct contact with the

vehicle's surface, using high-pressure water jets and chemical detergents instead. This method has the advantage of reducing the risk of scratches that can occur. However, it also has its drawbacks. The high-pressure jets can sometimes be too forceful, potentially damaging delicate parts of your car, such as the trim or antennas. The strong chemicals used in touchless washes can strip away protective coatings and may not completely remove stubborn dirt and grime. These washes are a better alternative to tunnel washes but still leave much to be desired.

Hand Washing Your Car

A two-bucket hand wash is the preferred method for its thoroughness and gentleness. One of the main advantages is that it allows for meticulous cleaning, as you can control the pressure and type of cleaning products used. By using one bucket for soapy water and another

for rinsing, you minimize the risk of dirt and debris being reintroduced to the car's surface reducing the chances of scratches and swirl marks. This method will maximize the life of your ceramic coating and paint protection film too. However, it is time-consuming and requires more effort compared to automated washes. It also demands a good understanding of proper washing techniques to avoid causing damage to the paintwork. Luckily, Mint Detail will be hosting the CIR on May 3rd to teach the proper wash methodology so you can wash at home with confidence!

In conclusion, while tunnel and touchless washes offer convenience, they come with risks. Hand washing, though more time-consuming, ensures a more meticulous and gentle cleaning, preserving your car's appearance and value. Hand washing will help maintain the longevity and beauty of your vehicle's exterior.



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
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
